Semiview. The governments seem to accept that some 2 million of our people cannot be found work, and yet they say we cannot reduce the hours of labour. And yet they still keep the old people and the children at work. They seem to accept the posttoon that some hundreds of thousands of workers, miners, agricultural labours and others, must live at a very low standard of life. But ministers have been trying in every way to restrict the great volume of food and goods which science has now made available for our use. It seems to me that this is a most appalling confession of absolute failure. It is as if mankind was mastered by his own inventions.

Semiview. I speak to you, iem as the leader of the Independent Labour Party, and in support of its candidates at this election. The Independent Labour Party on this occasion is not asking you to entrust us with the government of this country. We are only running a score of candidates in chosen constituencies in different parts. Suppose all our 20 candidates are returned we don't claim to govern the country. We ask you to send us there, so that whatever government is may be in power there will be one militant fighting group who will stand for an uncompromising Socialist policy, and will demand justice for the working class employed and unemployed.

We believe that we are living in a time of great opportunity for humanity, but we think that the two last governments - Matienal Government and Labour Covernment both failed to make the best use of the pessibilities. X Whichever of these governments may be returned as a result of this election I hope that we will have 25 I.L.P. members in that house, to drive them on to realise that now people can now have a decent opportunity for a full and comfortable life, and that it is the duty of the government, boldly, and without timidity, to make the necessary social and economic reconstruction that makes that possibility a reality.x
