This conference is evidence that statesmen realise the danger of the present scanty populations of the Deminions a total population of 1/75 of the world's - spread over 1/7 of its territory

Now, even with emigrants wanted, the problem is aggravated by the tendency of a declining birthrate in the memberland - and a population new more useful in the work of cities - than in the skilled labour of the land.
