Queen Mary sees the opening of new nurses quarters at St. Thomas Hospital. The Queen Mother is keenly interested in improvement of nurses' conditions. Here at St. Thomas Hospital she sees the new modern living quarters - the first step in a campaign to make the nursing profession more attractive in an attack on the problem of the great shortage of trained nurses.

History has accorded a venerable place to Florence Nightingale - who lit the Lamp of service establishing the traditions of Nursing.

The glorious work of tending suffering humanity deserves suitable reward, but the conditions of the work generally mean low pay, restricted liberty and long hours.

With the large increase in hospitals & health services the problem has become so serious that the Government have promised an enquiry.

"As part of its campaign for general fitness the Government is fully alive to the necessity of an adequate nursing service. Besides its aspect of service to the community the problem should be classed as the workers' in recruitment."

Nurses rarely complain - but they know what's wrong. What would make the work more attractive, Nurses?

"The good nurse always will like her work. It's only the conditions that want improving. Let the Nurses have her freedom and a private life after hours."

"Why not raise the pay of the Probationer - if they want more girls? £15 a year - who would be attracted by that?"

Already conditions are improving - hours have been shortened - but this increases the shortage. Nursing is a skilled profession and now the largely unskilled & menial jobs which were once part of her duties are taken over by cleaners - leaving the nurse free to play her proper role in the medical and healing work.

"The strongest argument held is that conditions are bound up by an obsolete hospital system"

I have been intimately connected with the nursing profession, during the whole of my professional life, which now extends to considerably over half a century. I have known nurses both in hospital practice and in civil practice, and have taken a very intense interest in their welfare and happiness, for the simple reason that, to the surgeon, the help and assistance of the nurse is --- important

Earlier in my ~~XXXXXX~~ career the life of the nurse was certainly very hard. The food was bad, the accommodation was bad and the liberty accorded to them was very deficient. As time went on these things have all improved and it is particularly observable in such large hospitals as Guy's Hospitals and the hospital for sick children to which I have been so closely associated for so many years that every possible care has been given to improve both the accommodation, the comforts, the well being and happiness of the nurses.

2 Because of the very hard work that these women have to perform their life of activity is necessarily short, and too early in their career they become too old to be attractive generally. At this stage there is unfortunately very little arranged for them, and one of the saddest experiences of one's life is to meet nurses who have been exceedingly useful during their active life living upon very ~~that~~ diminutive income.

The Nursing profession is a wonderful profession, but in order to make it attractive to the young, highly educated girl of the present day it is of vital importance that they should have more leisure more accommodation better pay and that when they cease to be actively engaged in their pursuits they should have some form of pension or another which will ensure them from being pauperised.

3 In order to make the profession attractive to young ladies it is essential that when they enter as probationers they should not be expected to perform menial duties, but to confine their activities to looking after and nursing patients. It is also exceedingly important that they should be guaranteed some form of ~~pension~~ pension so that when they reach old age and are no longer required by the public the end of their life should be spent in comfort.

1 For more than half a century I have been ~~more~~ intimately associated with nurses in hospital practice and in civil life, and during that time I have taken the greatest interest in the welfare, happiness and comfort of these people. To the surgeon the nurse is invaluable, so often the result of his operation depends to a very large extent upon the care, attention and judgment of the nurse in attendance on that case."
