This port has been used by the Italians to bring in supplies. 15" guns were prought into action for the first time in the Mediterranean since the war began. With superb efficiency and navigation the ship was at the given range at zero hours and a 15" shell weighing a ton hurtled through the air to the objective 15 miles away. The town lies on the top of an escarplement and there were petrol and ammunition dumps stationed in the locality. Spotting was done by Fleet Air Arm aircraft from the ships. Soon after leaving, the Fleet was attacked by enemy bombers but the effective co-operation of the R.A.F. fighters resulted in eleven enemy bombers being brought down into the sea.
