Long shot of the Legge Mount...the shattered bastion of the tower of LONDON...situated at the North End of the Outer West Wall Various shots showing the damage caused by the bomb which was unlucky to make a hit considering that many other bombs dropped harmlessly in the grass surrounds. | | | | |
| 2. | Various shots of the bomb holes which did no damage except to green grass. Scenes of the large pieces of stonework torn down by the bomb. Tracking shot up to the railings showing a little activity to get away from the continued static coverage which unfortunately was unavoidable. | | | | |
| 3. | ST. CLEMENTE DANE'S....and THE LAW COURTS. Long shot of St. Clement Dane's Church, most famous for its "Oranges and Lemons" fame. | | | | |
| 4. | Various shots of the damage showing the damage to the windows, Various shots of the statue of Dr. Samuel Johnson, who by the way used to worship in this Church, the statue remains damaged but not destroyed. The scene shows the statue itself and pans down to a wreath laid at the foot of the monument some time ago... the flowers of the wreath have now faded. Dr. Samuel Johnson wrote an essay on "The Art of Flying" and in the essay was contained the words "A man used to vicissitudes is not easily dejected" | | | | |
| 5. | Shots of damage to other statue and the camera pans to the wall showing an advertisement stuck up by the Westminster Corporation. | | | | |
| 6. | Long shot of the Church. The last shot in this roll shows the damage of the bomb done to LAW COURTS Notes; The original church of St. Clement of the Danes was built by the Danes, who were allowed to settle outside the City boundary after King Affies' victory. It was taken down and built again in 1682, Sir Christopher Wren being responsible for part of the design. The annual distribution of oranges and lemons to children at the Church is a revival of a centuries-old custom which was observed in Clement Inn. The fruit was distributed as the Church bells were rung on January the first of each year. The song went as;- | | | | |
