- Guns** 5 ft. EFFECTS only
- To shelter** 10 ft. And there go the Smith's ~~way~~ to spend another night in their family shelter listening to the all-too-familiar concert.
- In shelter** 21 ft. Chilly, uncomfortable, everybody getting temperamental (WATCH ACTION) That one was a bit near! But there's no need for anyone to be so uncomfortable. You will find your
- Letter box** 3 ft. letter box a small official
- Booklet** 7 ft. booklet which tells you how you can make your shelter much more ~~comfortable~~ *house like*
- Making bunks!**
Two shots with
pliers 17 ft. Wooden bunks can easily be made and fitted so that six people can sleep comfortably. Cover the frame with wire mesh -- there is plenty of this available now. Note how you bend the ends of the wire at right angles --
- Father hammering**
10 ft. hammer them into the wood - no nails or staples needed. But hammer them straight in not as Father is doing here!
- Bedding down** 12 ft. You see here how the bunks are fitted into the shelter. For covering, sleeping bags are best, don't forget some kind of mattress beneath them.
- Candle heater** 14 ft. DON'T have any oil stove or brazier in your shelter This little device will give all the warmth needful just two flower pots and a candle!
- Haybottle** 20 ft. You can keep liquid hot in a "Hay bottle", the booklet tells you how to contrive this using some woollen material, some straw and a little American cloth.

In shelter to lights out **20 ft.** **Dress warmly before you go to the shelter - don't risk getting chilled. Take your money with you and any important papers. A cup of tea and a biscuit just before turning in, and now to spend a comfortable night undisturbed by**

Guns **2 ft.** **the blitzkreig**

Raiders passed **2 ft.** **Aha! That sound wakes -- you**

Getting up **19 ft.** **all right.....nearly getting up time. Hang it the clock has ~~xy~~ stopped. Never mind. Thanks to taking the little precautions advised by the Ministry of Home Security the Smiths have passed a comfortable night and are ready---**
