The Golden Jubilee of the Army-Navy football series -- began back in 1890! The cadet gray and the middle blue occupy the stadium simultaneously -- for the first time in history! 4,500 future officers--drawn up in a combined before-game formation!.. a spectacle witnessed by a jam-packed one hundred and two thousand in Philadelphia's Municipal Stadium! Uncle Sam's famed Service Academies, showing the nation and the world a panorama of the unity that dominates America's defense forces....

A strring scene...friendly rivals - they clasp hands.

A rush to seats after the ceremonies! Navy Secretary Knox and Army Secretary Stinson lend official tone. And, look, an armored car...with grim-looking guards...must be important, says the Army mule....It's the Navy goat!!

Game time...rival captains shake hands...and highlights pop fast! First quarter, Navy's Bill Busik begins a spectacular day!

Navy's ball....Busik's off around end, then passes to Everett Malcom! The slow motion camera catches a mighty important Navy maneuvers...Midshipman Malcom has the pigskin again! Down to the 6 yard line!

Still the future admirals...Busik roars over tackle for the touchdown!

The Army's chance now....Cadet John Hatch passes to Ted Lutryzkowski! Army's ball... Hatch is back again....he gets off another heave to Lutryzkowski! Here's a play that saw everything! Hatch passes to the goal line...Werner intercepts for the Navy..but he's hit--hard--and fumbles....Army recovers!

But that's all for Army...that stalwart Navy line won't be crossed..Hatch is really sneaky! Into the 3rd quarter, with Navy operating again...#70, Howard Clark, is the big gun!

Navy's ball....and Clark, little one-hundred and sixty pound Midshipman who apparently knows all the illusive tricks of the gridiron game! and that was a block!!

The touchdown play's a honky....Clark to Malcom...just like that! Later--Army and the Ladies of Liberty...M. upin to Power! The crowd presses close as time runs out. Even though play's still underway, they've stormed the goal posts! It's a rare sight of an enthusiastic crowd that almost refused to let the game come to a finish. Now, they're all over the playing field...what a sight, and what an end to this 50th anniversary Army-Navy classic! With Navy winning, 14-0! The players and referee are still talking--but for the crowd, the 1940 game is gridiron history. Then, suddenly, the strains of the national anthem...and not a soul moves...and they're loose again!... 102 000 Americans moving a whole of a good time! It's the Middies' day--and the cadets just stand and take it!
