1.	<u>THIS IS THE SERVICES CENTRAL BOOK DEPOT.</u> Here & at other sub-depots in the country are received books & magazines for distribution to the three fighting services. The come largely from the public who generously hand over the counter of their local postoffice their spare books and magazines to provide reading matter for our men & women in the fighting forces.				
2.	The postoffice send free of charge the books handed over if they are unwrapped, unstamped, unaddressed. Streams of postoffice vans arrive daily loaded with stacks of books.				
3.	The Depot is a vast hive of activity; here the books are made up into large formed Libraries for static camps, field libraries for the bases and lines of communications overseas, small balanced collections of books for R.A.F. stations, coast defences and anti-aircraft posts, supplies for mobile libraries, parcels of books that will go in the pocket for men in the front line. Libraries are also sent to transports, and to the Naval sub-depot for distribution to the various units of the British Fleet.				
4.	Suitable foreign books go to our Allies. 'Nation' parcels of magazines and periodicals are sent with unflinching regularity. At the depot the busy workers can be seen labelling parcels for practically every place in the world wher our fighting men are to be found.				
5.	In one corner damage books are repaired by a staff of voluntary workers, while another repair depot is housed elsewhere. Five million books & three million magazines have already gone out to our forces, but more & more are required. So hand that book & magazine when you have finished reading it to your local postmaster. You will be doing Britian's warriors, men & women from all countries of the commonwealth, a great service.				
6.	THE QUEEN WALKS AROUND & WATCHES THE WORK GOING ON & CHATS WITH THE WORKERS GREATLY INTERESTED.				
7.	Books arriving by mailvan in sacks, sacks being emptied & sorted out, various types of books & different Authors are carefully handled, Magazines are sorted & tied together in neat bundles. Repairing the damaged books & then the packing into parcels, labled for dispatching. loading van with bundles of Mags & parcels of books for the journey all over the world.
