The principal items about which the Press should not write are:-

- (i) Air tactical methods, including height of releasing torpedoes.
- (ii) Operational range and bomb loads of all aircraft.
- (111) Method of wing folding (Fulmar and later types).
 - (iv) W/T gear, bomb release gear, and bomb or torpedo sights, other than the course-setting bomb sight and the simple torpedo bead-sight.
 - (v) Torpedo aiming camera and assessing table and any method of ground instruction designed to simulate air training.
 - (vi) Recognition lights or signals.
- (vii) Gun alignment.
- (viii) Night dummy deck-landing lighting.
 - (ix) Length of courses and their strengths.
 - (x) Duplex Pistols.
 - (x1) Torpedo Air Rudders.
 - (xii) Speed of aircraft when dropping.

The above also applies to films ophotographs.
