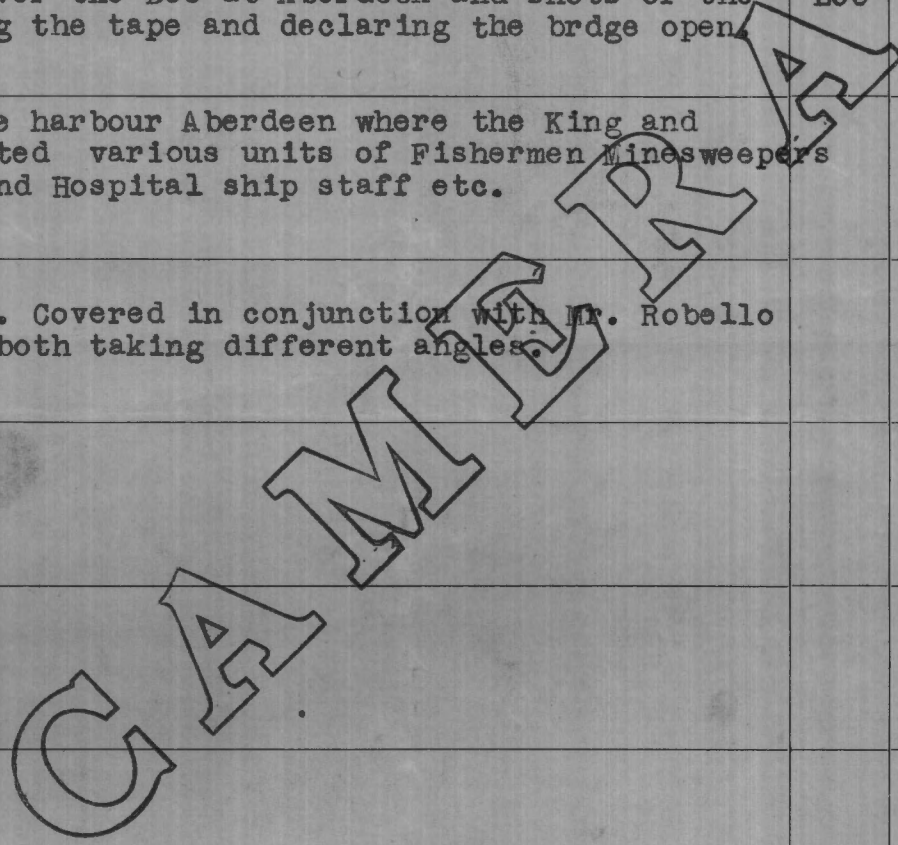

CAMERAMAN'S REPORT.

Graham Thomson	250 ft.	
10th March	Light - Very bad.	(Interior shots from 3 punch marks onwards.)
Dundee - Royal Visit.	Silent	

- Roll 1. (200 ft.)
1. Children with flags cheering as Royal Party approaches.
 2. Arrival at Blackness Foundry. (crowd sweeps around camera). Shots inside Foundry (very dark). Various shots same. NOTE: the film is punched three times at this point.

EXTERIOR. Dutch Submarine commander receives D.S.O. from King - (Commander's face is not to be shown).

King receives a Naval welcome (C.U. and M.S. piping him in, after which the Royal couple inspects mine sweeping crews with mine sweepers in background. (Roll 11 - 50 ft.)

REMARKS: As the 200 ft. roll unwinds the three punch marks at edge of film after about 90 ft. mark end of exterior shots - the remaining 110 ft. should be developed as far as possible.
