1.	Scenes taken at the Sawmill. Logs being washed in pond and placed on hoist Interior of mill. sawing the logs etc.	100	24	Dull	W.A.
2.	Cutting the waste into firewood. checking the size of logs Trimming the ends to size and placing on snute and loading on to lorries. General views of mill. with load of cut planks leaving and lorry arriving with logs from the forests.	100	24	Dull	
3.	Hauling logs from the forest. General views of lorry coming down mountainside. Logs being hauled down by endless wire whip. and tractors. Making roads on the mountainside for the tractors etc.	100	24	Dull	
4.	Undercutting trees (Larch) and felling them. Note view of Camp below and countryside. S.U. of the operations trimming the log of branches prior to hauling to camp.	100	24	Dull	
5.	Loading trimmed logs onto trucks. Trimming the logs before loading. Various G.U. and cut in shots of the men. A group of men having a short rest and cup of hot soup. The smokes being provided by a kind serjeant.	100	24	Dull	
6.	There are almost 2000 men of the Canadian Forestry Corps now at work in various camps throughout the country. They arrived on Xmas Day and have not been long getting down to the job of felling timber for the Ministry of Supply. There are about 200 men at this particular camp				
7.	and they like all the others were specially picked lumbermen from all parts of Canada. The men in the pictures come from the Great Lakes and the towns of Fort Arthur and Fort William. Many of them served in the last war. They only receive about a third of the pay they received for the same work in peacetime occupation. Over 275 trees are felled				
8.	a day and the mill turns out over 200 logs per day. The most modern methods are used and the equipment which is the most up to date was all brought over with them. THIS WOULD HAVE MADE A BETTER PICTURE IF THE SUN HAD BEEN SHINING BUT IF DEVELOPED FULLY FOR CONTRAST IT SHOULD NOT BE TOO BAD.
