

POLICEMEN WIN TOP AWARDS IN PISTOL MATCHES

Detroit Man Captures Aggregate Prize

Yesterday was policeman's day at the tenth annual mid-winter national pistol matches here as cops from Tampa and Detroit took top honors in almost half the matches.

Biggest award, the national center-fire championship, went to Harry W. Reeves, of the Detroit police team. His aggregate score of 865 in four events topped by 11 points the winning score shot last year by Walter R. Walsh, of the FBI.

Reeves, in winning the center-fire championship, became eligible for the I. W. Phillips trophy, a permanent award.

Frank Wright, a Tampa policeman, won the first match of his career with a score of 199 in the center-fire slow fire match. Another Tampa cop, R. L. Standau, also pulled out a 199, but was outranked by Wright and put in second place.
