Women's part in the war becomes daily more important. During a Royal two-day tour of the Southern Command the Queen inspected units of the A.T.S. These are the girls in uniform who do military jobs and live a military life, complete here with outdoor kitchen. The firewatchers wear the treusers, a garb that would deceive more than an incendiary.

A glimpse at a Spitfire factory illustrates the vital part now played by the woman worker.

There are forty girls here to every sixty men, and there's room for more. Ernest Bevin has said that there's been a fine response to his appeal for a hundred-thousand women for war work. He asks employers for better co-operation than they have given so far.

The Spitfire to-day is even more deadly than it was last year. Its amazing performance was demonstrated by a famous test pilot.

An army thoroughly well equipped, up-to-date and trained to the last ounce was on view as General Alexander conducted His Majesty's tour of the Southern Command.

The Royal visit was no secret. In fact civilian enthusiasm was so great that the King's progress was only made possible when the troops took on the role of police.
