Following three weeks' drought, vast fires broke out in the huge forests of the Eastern States. In New Jersey, where seventy-thousand acres were destroyed, many of the forty-five outbreaks were proved to be the work of incendaries.Experts estimate it will take thirty years to replace the valuable forests destroyed.
