INDIANS TRAIN HERE TO MAKE MUNITIONS.

At the Ministry of Labour Mr. Ernest Bevin welcomed to Britain fifty Indian trainees. A golden garland for the Minister symbolised Indian allegiance to the mother country.

The Indians receive their training at a factory in the Home Counties, where they learn the skilled work of airplane rigging and tool making. When they've completed the course they'll be qualified to return to India and instruct workers there. In successive batches of fifty more men will take the course as long as the war lasts.

Mr. Amery, Secretary of State for India, visited the instruction factory and learned that the men are drawn from twelve different castes and come from all over the country. By this scheme India herself will eventually produce aircraft in big numbers.
