## THE PALL OF FORT RUTBAH, IRAQ.

The point of this movement was an asceplane to fly over the fort, drop a message demanding their surrender. The fort was surrounded by the famous Arab Legion and other troops. Failing a white flag being flown the planes would start beshing an hour later. There was no white flag shown so the planes started beshing. After a few bushs had been dropped an acroplane of our dropped us a message seying a white flag was flying. We moved forwards to occupy it when they epened fire on us again so a signal was laid on ground to our planes seying continue attack, which they did. The fort was evacuated at night by the Iraqis and cocupied by us in the merning by R.A.F. Armoured Cars.
