1.	This is one of the Royal Ordnance Factories, Administered by the Ministry of Supply. These factories have been greatly increased in number since the outbreak of war, and in those existing before the war production have been stepped up. At this particular factory building was started in April of last				
2.	year, production began in October, & the first Gun was turned out in the following January. Production is now ahead of schedule. The Girl workers include former waitresses, shop assistants, nurses, actresses, barmaids & domestic servants. Some are married, with husbands in the Army to wh which this factory supplies anti-tank guns & anti aircraft guns.				
3.	Girls do a variety of jobs, from simply machining to the more difficult honing, boring & rifling; from plain filing to fitting (with accuracy of two tenths ten thousandths of an inch. Girls operate trucks and overhead cranes, & they work as "slingers" slinging the guns by ropes before they are lifted by cranes.
