For evacuated mothers and children Mr. and Mrs. J.B. Priestley are conducting country house hostels, the best way, they contend, of overcoming the difficulties of making evacuees feel at home.

Tommy Maloney of Stepney(3-and-a-half) has been adopted by Mrs. Roosevelt for the duration.

In the three hostels they already run, and the three more they will open shortly, the Priestleys believe they are starting a social experiment, which may extend and continue after the war. The Government pays rent and rates; the rest comes from the parents, charities and the U.S. foster-parents scheme. America also sends toys. This consignment was very soon distributed.
