

NAVY INTERCEPTS NAZI SUPPLY SHIPS.

Latest pictures of the war at sea show an aftermath of the sinking of the Bismarck. That ill-fated battleship put to sea with supply ships and while escorting a convoy in the tropics our men-of-war sighted two unidentified vessels. One of them was the tanker Esso Hamburg, whose crew at once scuttled her and were picked up by our ships.

A Walrus aircraft made a spectacular descent as it came back to report that our warships had sunk the Nazi submarine depot ship Egerbund and taken the crew prisoner. Several other Bismarck supply-ships were also sunk.

The Nazis were picked up by a destroyer and transferred to a cruiser, which had more room for them.

Meanwhile another destroyer was despatched to sink the tanker, a sight as comforting as it is spectacular.

The German sailors are out of the war till it is over and done with. In British hands they will be well fed and well treated. Most of them are young but there was one old-timer from the days of Von Tirpitz. It vos goot, ja !
