The hoses that beat the Blitz, and 6,000 of the men and women behind them, took a fireman's holiday at the great Hyde Park Civil Defence parade - the largest ever held in Britain. There to receive the congratulations of the Prime Minister the 6,000 represented 200,000 recruited in London alone, - themselves but a fraction of the civil defence army that holds the fort throughout the country.
