King George of Greece has left Egypt on his way to South Africa. On the platform with him at Cairo was Crown Princess Frederika. The British Ambassador Sir Miles Lampson came to speed him on his way. With all Greek territory in enemy hands her government continues the fight abroad. King George himself was in Crete when the Nazi invasion began. However, after dramatic adventures, he escaped to Egypt. By her bravery Greece inspired the world.

Twenty-two-year-old Lieutenant Singh Bhagat is India's first V.C. of the war.
