"Patrol Activity" - two words which have become so familiar to the public in War Communiques, and these pictures give some impression of a front line Patrol at work, and also the results of some of their efforts. Shots show - Receiving a message in a wireless truck, as to where the enemy Patrol are active - Ditto. The message being taken to the squadron commander - Ditto calling up the Section Commander - Section Commander and Squadron Commander discussing plans over the maps. Section Commander signalling to his Section Leaders - Ditto receiving their instructions - Ditto boarding their vehicles to set off on the patrol - Ditto vehicles moving off etc.
Thursday
The sound of an enemy plane has been heard, so the patrol quickly disperses and takes up positions under cover of gorse-bushes - (the only protection from view the desert affords). As the sound of the plane dies away, the patrol moves stealthily forward to make contact with the enemy. Ditto Ditto etc. Here are the results of some of these patrols - German prisoners in a desert camp (arriving) Shots self explanatory, close-ups etc. Single line of captured officers. Note slovenly appearance of officers, boots close-up etc.
