Patrol Activity" - two words which have become so familiar to the public in War Communiques, and these pictures give some impression of a front line Patrol at work, and also the results of some of their efforts. Shots show - Receiving a message in a wireless truck, as to where the enemy Patrol are active -Ditto. The message being taken to the squadron commander -Ditto calling up the Section Commander - Section Commander and Squadron Cormander discussing plans over the maps. Bection Commander signalling to his Section Leaders - Ditto receiving their instructions - Ditto boarding their vehicles to set off on the patrol - Ditto vehicles moving off etc.

The sound of an enemy plane has been heard, so the patrol quickly disperses and takes up positions under cover of gorsebushes - (the only protection from view the desert affords). As the sound of the plane dies away, the patrol moves steathily forward to make contact with the enemy.
