The first gamery practice in P-30s of the 30th squadron of the 31st Pursuit Group was held at Camp Skeel July 21, 22, 2nd 25. Six planes were used for most of the firing, which included the 30 and 50 caliber machine game and the 37 millimeter cannon.

The ships were P-39's "Airceobras" manufactured by the Hell Aircraft Corporation. It was the first time the 39th squadron ever had assembled six such planes for gunnery practice and it was the first time a 37-millimeter cannon ever had been fired from an airplane during routine gunnery practice.
