We are putting this story aboard the Clipper before using it in our own reel, therefore no off-stage copy is available. Of course, the basic idea is to show how the "V" drive is making itself felt in the United States. The 2 opening statue HINK scenes and the German sequence provide the news carriage for the story. The radio men shown leaving New York are the first of the volunteer technicians to be accepted by the recently organized Civilian Technical Corps for noncombatant service in England. They'll go to Montreal, where they will be quartered at Lower Canada College for a short period before sailing. They enter the V story because they are going to help in Britain's final Victory. At the NBC listening post they hear the famous ... Ve The British American Ambulance Corps creates the V Clubs of America as a national auxiliary. The rest of the material is self-explanatory, TEXES depicting the spread of the V movement throughout the United States.
