1. BLITZ BOATS!

Defense speed up! A new plant for the construction of landing boats! Named for Andrew J. Higgins, their builder, they have already won their spurs in Norway and Crete. Here, landing boats demonstrate a quick invasion, landing carriers' boats with a 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ -ton tank on deck. An armored car and truck follow, Now--planes versus torpedo boats! And the little sea freighter fighter really shows its agility and maneuvering skill! No wonder Uncle Sam has given a big okay to these boats!

1. NAVY RUNS HEAVY PLANT!

Back to work at the Federal Shipbuilding and Drydock Company yards! Uncle Sam in charge now -- and under Navy supervision work resumes on 500 million dollars worth of warships and merchant vessels! 15 thousand men were idle for more than 2 weeks. The men struck over an issue relating to management co-operation in the collection of their union dues. To the Navy comes an offer from company President L.H.
