## 15 NATIO'S AT ALLIED COUNCIL

#### FILMS FOR WORLD TO SEE

Mr. Eden, the Foreign Secretary, presiding at the meeting of the Allied Council at which Mr. Maisky spoke, said resolutions would be submitted "regarding the Roosevelt-Churchill "charter" and the Churchill "charter' and the supply of essential needs to

supply of essential needs to Europe after the war.

The conference was held in the picture gallery of St. James's Palace. Films were taken and journalists from America and other countries were there to report the procedeings to the world. Delegates attended from Canada, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Free France, Greece, Yugoslavia, Russia, Poland Norway, Holland and Luxemburg.

#### Greeks Honoured

It was the first time Russia had been represented at the Allied Council and Mr. Eden gave a special welcome to Mr. Maisky and the other Soviet delegate, Mr.

Bogomoloff.

He also welcomed M. Tsouderos the Greek Premier, and M. Varvaressor, the Defence Minister who have just arrived in this country with the King of Greece.

"We are proud to have with us the representatives of the gallant Greek nation, whose heroic resistance has been a source of inspiration to the whole Allied cause," said Mr. Eden.
