EDEN'S SPEECH: LV SPEAKING.

"Gentlement at the conclusion of the last inter-Allied meeting on the 12th of June, I expressed the hope that it might be possible for us to inaugurate at the outcome of that meeting a new phase of collaboration and that the meeting might form part of the machinery through which tiexthread victory would be won and by which peace would be maintained after victory.

our Prime Minister, Mr. Churchill, and to invite it's acceptance by the Allied governments. If there is still time this morning of or if not at this afternoon's session we will proceed to the discussion of the resolution regarding of the supply of the essential requirements to Europe after the war which is the second purpose of this meeting."

It is the task which attems the present time unites all the governments which have sent their representatives to this conference.
