The swelling flow of victory-producing war supplies sweeps over the ocean with daily increasing momentum. Under the double stimulus of rapidly mounting production, and rapidly dwindling Nazi success in the Atlantic, the tide of Lend-Lease material grows to an irresistible flood.

World-famous American journalists saw the latest cargoes arrive - altogether an encouraging proof of the unbreakable bond between the two countries - twin pillars of the democratic cause. These men, by press and radio, helped to bring millions in America round to hundred-per cent support in the fight against Germany.

(INTERIOR) As soon as the tanks are docked they get a quick check-over. Armourers inspect the Brownings and cannon that bristle from the turrets. Here at the port it's not only the quantity, but the variety of war material that impresses. Field-guns, destined eventually, we hope, to shell Germans in Germany. The explosives to fire them! Beautiful bombs - not likely to be here very long - come in by the thousand. Protective bands enable them to be handled undamaged. They pack a punch that's being felt all over Germany. They talk the language Hitler understands, and they talk it louder. We've got a million of 'em, and we're going to give them away - to Germany.

Predictors two are being made in the States. It all shows how the whole of American industry is getting on to a war basis. It's taking us time to overhaul Germany but we've got to do it, and leave her far behind. ATS girls help to unpack and complete the assembly of Tommy-guns. These invaluable weapons are coming over in the enormous numbers a modern army requires.

(CU GIRL TESTING) Packed for distribution Tommy-guns and other war supplies are transported to the units waiting for them. These pictures show just one facet of war production, now on a scale almost beyond human comprehension. It will grow larger yet. In the Battle of the Atlantic last quarter we lost only one-third the number of vessels sunk in the previous quarter. Lend-Lease and home production are mounting. The supplies are on the road that leads to shattering Nazi defeat.
