Major Gen Bonesteel U.S. Army met by Major General H.O. Curtis C.B., D.S.O. M.C. on Quay at Reykjavik (Major Gen. Bonesteel is Commander of U.S. Army in Iceland. Major Gen. Curtis is Commander of British Army and has full command over both Forces).

Walking from Quay with officers of Navy and Air Force. Rear Admiral R.J.R. Scott R.N., Brig.Gen. Marston U.S. Marines, Air Commodore Primrose Commanding Icelandic Air Forces.

Salute of 4 P40 Machines of American Air Force and band to party on Quay.

The villagers are using the Hot Springs which supply their houses with Boiling water to wash the troops' shirts, socks, etc. (It is impossible to take pictures of natives doing the work as they refuse to be photographed). The hot springs are normally used to supply the heat in the greenhouses where the fruits, vegetables and flowers are grown.

14th September, 19

Boy with milk on a pony bringing milk to an outpost at Thingvellir. C.U. Milk being taken off and Dog and boy.

The lookout on duty, surveys the roads, plain and lake, also spots for enemy aircraft, gives weather reports and wind direction.

On the front they use a winch and fasten a hook on the article and pull, they also use Tip Truck. (these pictures must be taken irrespective of weather as this will only go on for a few more days. You will see the weather conditions).
