Attached under full war conditions to the infantry of the invading army.

Carriers go into battle, personally went in as well on carriers late evening, low light spoiled shooting in end. Early morning scenes of men washing etc in railway station yard which was temporary H.Q.

Producing field news sheet for troops and men in group reading same. Idea in this particular unit only, and is designed to give the men some idea of what is going on around them plus various scandal etc to liven things up, produced daily or more often if required. A very useful idea and much appreciated by the men. Various attacking scenes etc on railway bridges.

Counter attack on railway (may be part on two) actually fished out enemy given as dead by mortar fire according to Umpire just before patrol arrived. More early morning scenes in farm yard of men preparing to attack, camouflaged signal truck etc.

Starts similar scenes to above.

Into action again with carriers. Not too hot. Setting men in ambush positions etc awaiting counter attack which never came.

Awaiting attack which never came, then given as out by umpire for no reason at all, three hours wait and then put back in fight. Ten mins. later given as wiped out by shell fire. Never saw any enemy at time.

THIS ENDS ALL MATERIAL ACTUALLY SHOT ON THE SCHEME ITSELF. REST OF ROLL AND ALL ROLL SEVEN ARE SHOTS OF CARRIERS AND MOTOR CYCLISTS CHARGING ACROSS FIELDS AND THROUGH HEDGES ETC SPECIALLY STAGED FOR ME. NOTE THAT THE CARRIERS ARE GOING ABSOLUTELY ALL OUT AND I DOUBT IF ANY FASTER PICTURES CAN BE OBTAINED.

Bren gun covers a bridge - and close of soldier.

Officer receiving reports and studying map.

Soldiers concealed behind bushes and officers with maps.

Odd shots of explosions representing shell fire.

Portable radio at work.

A Sergeant Major gets into "Civvies" to be a 5th column-ist.

Close ups and walking away into the enemy's country.

Short shots of planes.

The shots are rather a "hetch-potch" and are of the "Germans".

Waited for several hours for an attack by the Home Forces but nothing materialised.
