In Lancashire 15-hundred girl war workers have settled down in the first hostel opened under a nation-wide scheme. Away from home for the duration the women live in the country and have their own buses to-and-from work. The afternoon mail's waiting for them at the hostel post office when they come in.

Each shift sits down 500-strong to three meals a day. They get full board and lodging for 25/- a week - more comfort and more company than in private digs.

They have their own laundry, much better equipped than a house bathroom; so well, in fact, that it makes doing the smalls quite a pleasure.

In the lounging a few hundred girls enjoy a rest before turning in.

And so to bed, by way of the bathroom. This is shot by the automatic camera which stops when the taps are turned off.

When she thinks the bath's just right she - Hard Luck !
