**VESSEL HERE WITH AIRMEN, MISSIONARIES**

The shipload of Anzac airmen bound for Canada and England monopolized attention and passenger space today when a vessel arrived from the Antipodes. Also aboard were about 180 other passengers, most of whom are to continue to the coast when the ship sails at 4 p.m. today.

Next in size to the Anzac contingent was the group of 75 missionaries and educators who left the middle east in May to escape danger during the British invasion of Syria. Head of the party is Dr. Harry Dorman, missionary doctor who has been connected with the medical school and hospital of the American university in Beirut, Syria. It took Dr. Dorman, his wife, his son, Donald and other members nearly four months to reach Honolulu. They waited for transportation a month in Palestine and 41 days in Cairo.
