KING & QUEEN SEE BOMB DAMAGE.

London has suffered a minor blitz. Small though it is by comparison with the raids of three years ago, the damage in places has been severe. Many lives and much valuable property have been destroyed.

Prize number one continues to elude the Luftwaffe. Security regulations do not permit us to say just where the bombs have fallen. Londoners have had another chance to show that they can take it. There seems no doubt that the Nazis made these raids to satisfy the German public's desire for revenge.

The King and Queen lost no time in making an informal tour of the damaged areas and expressing their sympathy with people who have been bombed-out.

These raids may prove to be among the last despairing efforts of the German airmen. The Air Minister has told Parliament that complete air supremacy may soon be ours and the way to complete military victory be opened up.
