"Ive been asked to tel you just a little about the new plan for better health. Our plan is a service which will provide the best medical advice and treatment to everyone - every men, wo man and child in this country. Whatever your ein income, if you want to use this service nobody is going to try and make you is your den't want to, there will be no charge for treatment. The National Hea Health Service will include family doctors who eak you can choose for yourselves and who will attend you in your own homes when this is necessary. It will cover any medecines you may need. Specialists's edeinee, advice and , f course, hespital treatment whatever the illness, special care for mothers and children and a lot of other things beside. In fact, every kind of advice and treatment you may need."

3. SV Willink speaking.

"This is got to be not only a full service but also a really human and personal service. We are out to improve the health of every family and the whole nation. If we out out the money worries which illness brings then there would be no reason to put off gotting advice and treatment. We could build up good health instead of just trying to mend bad health."

4. SCU Willink speaking.

"Now all the details have been set out in a White Paper and in a shorter pamphlet and you find there, the arrangements the Government propose for the doctors, hospitals, the local authorities and so on."

5. FULL CU Willink speaking.

"It's not a cut and dried scheme, these proposals are for discussion by Parliament, and we want them talked about by everybedy concerned and you, everyone in this audience are very much concerned."

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
