MACARTHUR INSPECTS TROOPS - Allied commander sees the First Cavalry division which conquered the Admiralty Islands.

General MacArthur and Major General Swift, commander of the 1st Cavalry - a famous horse outfit, now trained to tropical island warfare. Insteads of boots and saddles, they go in for jungle acrobatics. The Commander of forces based on Australia selected the dismounted first cavalry for the amphibious operations in the conquest of the Admiralty Islands - which General MacArthur directed on the scene.

SHOOTING DOWN JAPS - American task force, attacked by Jap planes, sends enemy flyers to fiery and watery deaths.

Battleship Oklahoma, which capsized at Pearl Harbour, presented a most difficult job of salvage and refloating. Bombed and torpedoed by the Japs in their sneak punch, the sea giant turned over - and now they are fighting the Oklahoma. A maze of powerful cables pulls the battleship over - the ponderous steel hull drawn around slowly to an upright position. Many thought that the vessel could never be salvaged, but these motion pictures made by the Navy show the floating of the ship so gravely damaged. In drydock, right side up and afloat the sea giant ready for further repairs. And the idea is that the Oklahoma will be refitted and will go into battle against the Japs - avenging Pearl Harbour.
