

SEA LANDINGS STRENGTHEN BURMA ARMY

Latest pictures from the Arakan front report the assault on the road between Boothidaung and Maungdaw, where the Japanese had to be dislodged from tunnel fortresses in the hillside. The situation was soon well in hand.

(after xplosion) The mosque at Maungdaw was profaned by the enemy and used as a Fortress. Meanwhile off the Arakan coast appeared landing craft, bringing reinforcements and supplies. Many of the new troops were commandos, from Gen. Auchinleck's India Command. As we receive these pictures the enemy is redoubling his attack at Inphal, North Burma, before the Monsoon breaks in three week's time. The allies are confident they will hold on.
