Latest pictures from the Arakan front report the assault on the road between Boothidaung and Haungdaw, where the Japanese had to be dislodged from tunnel fortresses in the hillside. The situation was seen well in hand.

(aftr Xplosh) The mosque at Maungdaw was profaned by the enemy and used as a Fortress. Meanwhile off the Arakan coast appeared landing craft, bringing reinfortements and supplies. Many of the new troops were commandes, from Gen. Auchinleck's India Command. As we receive these pictures the enemy is redoubling his attack at Imphal, North Burma, before the Monsson breaks in three we k's time. The allies are confident they will hold on.
