> It is believed that it shows the same subjects covered by Sgt. Cur tis on stills "Cassino in early stages of the Offensive" as follows:-

On Friday the 12th May 1944, the Allied Forces of tanks and infantry started their attack on the Gustav Line. The men were given the job of holding Castle Hill and sections of the town of Cassino, whilst other units attacked the energy's left and right flanks.

Waiting in the ruins of St. Angelo school for enemy tanks which may attempt to break out of Cassino is this 6 pounder Anti-tank gun which had to be stripped and rebuilt in the ruins by the crew.

Sniper in action, looks out for enemy trying to escape from Cassino.

Bombardment of 25 pounders on German machine gun nests in houses at the bottom of Castle Hill.

Smoke screen being laid on Monastery Hill to blind the German O.P. watching Allied attack on Cassino.

Heavy bombardment on the Monastery with H.E. and smoke shells.

Guards sitting in the ruins of St. Angelo Church prepare their weapons ready for future battle.

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
