- 1. King & Theen visit flying bomb damage, while on tour at A. stations shortly after explosion.
- 2. Speaking with workers inspecting damaged property.
- 3. Arrival at one of A.A. gun stations.
- 4. Inspecting guns and crews.
- 5. At a Reagy A.A. Site, the party as just in time to witness an attack on several flying bombs by A.A. and fighters.
