Streamlined food service, with meals prepared and served by production line methods are offered Boeing Aircraft Co. employees. The food service center will supply food for 40 mobile units which will distribute meals throughout the factory area at lunch times. Each mobile unit is designed to serve ten customers per minute. The cafeteria provides meal service to employees not only during lunch periods but also before and after shift changes, thereby giving the workers the opportunity to eat more than one meal per day at the plant. There is an automatic pie-making machine with a capacity of 350 pies an hour. D
