 They made their crossing with assault boats under artillery
 fire, the enemy positions were taken and the Coys. consolidated
 until the other Coys made their landings with Brens and Rifles.

A. 700/185/3 The assault on Tilburg by the 9th Cameromans commenced at 2 p.m. this afternoon when the Canal was crossed by 'A' Coy. pushing their way across the blown Railway Bridge under fire from enemy snipers and machine gun posts along the canal. When the Coy. had cleared the opposition which was not stiff or prolonged, the rest of the Battalion crossed in assault boats to establish their bridgehead on the other bank and so to pass into the town of Tilburg. Once in the town we found the 6th Bn. Royal Scots Fus just entering from the South-West. The civilians soon came out from their shelters to welcome the troops.

A. 700/185/4 From their position on the Wilhelmina Canal just outside Tilburg, on the Hertogenbosch road, 9th Bn. Cameromans today forced the Canal by blown railway bridge and by assault boats under the harassing fire of snipers and one or two machine guns in these early stages. Our snipers and machine gunners silenced them one by one. While smoke bombs are laid by mortar to prevent observation by enemy Observation Posts. Shortly after consolidating in the sector of Tilburg they were joined by the 6th Royal Scots Fusiliers who crossed the Canal at Brest and entered Tilburg by the road from the South-east. Shortly after the first troops entered a surprised was caused by the entry of an ENSA girl with a poster advertising the first concert which they will give in liberating Tilburg and which was pinned up by a Company Commander of the Cameromans.
