Assignment FAIREY FIREFLY - FLEET AIR ARM GETS NEW FIGHTER.

Scenes The Fairey Firefly is a new Naval Fighter/Reconnaissance Aircraft of unique design and outstanding performance. Carrying an Observer as well as a Pilot, it is ideally suited for Fleet Air Arm operations where searching and shadowing are so essential. In addition it carries four 20 m.m. cannons and can give a good account of itself as a fighter. Superimposed on these fighter characteristics, it has short take off and folding wings together with the special visibility required of carrier borne aircraft.

- (1) AERIAL SHOTS SHOWING CLEAN LINES IN HEAD-ON VIEWS, AND SPECIAL WING FLAPS. (These flaps not only improve take off, but when used at certain heights make the Firefly more manoeuvrable than the majority of modern single seat fighters).
- (2) GROUND SHOTS SHOW TAKE OFFS AND LANDINGS AND MACHINE WITH AND WITHOUT WINGS FOLDED.
