Fresh from the front line little batches of men are daily arriving in the Belgian capital of 48 hours' leave. Hotels have been requisitioned for them, and real beds seem heavenly after the mud of Holland.

Entertainment is on a lavish scale, provided by N.A.A.F.I. and the Army Welfare Service. And it is all free. During this blissful 48 hours there are no restrictions. The men get that complete mental change, so necessary in modern warfare. Experience shows that even two brief days are a marvellous tonic.

Everybody who wants a quiet life - and hundreds of them do, after the stress of battle - is well catered for. Letters home are written by the thousands and in the evening Belgian girls join in the dancing. If the war goes on much longer it is to be hoped that they will spend their next leave, at home.
