DESCRIPTION:

This film was shot between 10 00 and 14 00 hrs in and around the German village of Geilenkirchen. The town was taken by the 1st Bn. Infantry Regiment Chith Division whose objective was the town beyond.

After an intensive bombardment by Artillery and Plane which lasted about two days, at dawn of the 19th November the Infantry moved into After a fight which lasted most of the day the town was About 14, 00 hrs the troops reached the other side of the taken. town and moved into the country. Around 300 German prisoners were taken, but some of them only after having been persuaded by airfire, Grenades etc. The effective use of Physicological Warfares was a Coctor in the surrender of many prisoners. The city was protected by Mines, Pilitoxes, and complicated dugouts. Most of the strongpoints were neuterlized before the attack, and Engineers and Tanks mounting flails cleared the mains. This was the ilrst day these troops have had a close in battle with the enemy.
