As a result of the recent drive by ~~the~~ from the area of Weert to the line of the River Maas an area has been freed where in peace time there was more traffic on the canals than on the roads. The shortage of roads proved a brake on our advance as did the abundance of canals, and so thoroughly did the enemy do his demolition work that it will be ~~long~~ long after the war before the full canal system is again in use.

Already during the war the canals were falling into disuse under the deadening hand of the German occupation and now wrecked or stranded barges line empty or half empty canals while the way is blocked frequently by blown bridges, lock gates and improvised roads which we used to cross the canals in our advance by bulldozing the banks into the canal. In the undamaged or slightly damaged barges, the bargees live in enforced idleness, waiting patiently for the time when they will again be able to ply their trade on these now silent canals.

DESCRIPTION : Civilian workers for Gestapo, FFI and French Civil Police march Germans through town to prison. German City Military Police and civilian workers for Gestapo, ~~now prisoners removing personal belongings to be inspected by American M.P.'s.~~ Prisoners putting belongings together, lining up and marching to cells. Some called back to police area. Interior views of refugees in various rooms of house formerly occupied by German General of Work Groups, name Helff. Pictures of different families, 32 persons, their barge broke down when Germans were still in Strasbourg, and they could not get priority for repairs. When Americans arrived they were housed here and will be turned over to the Refugee Camp. They and their luggage and possessions which could be carried by person. The rest was left on the barge. This footage shows children and people in rooms. They are from Holland. Barges in Rhine River. Shots of Refugees leaving house with belongings, getting on to vehicle to be transported to camp and vehicle leaving. Barge crew and families left un-repaired barge in Rhine River, they were brought in by American Troops to PW enclosure. Prisoners belongings being searched for knives, mirrors, etc., by American Military personnel.
