

KING HONOURS MEN OF ARNHEM

Five hundred of the men who survived at Arnhem were received at the Palace by His Majesty the King. There to witness the ceremony was U.S. General Brereton, Commander, 1st Airborne Army. The British Commander, General Browning, was awarded the C.B. and more than sixty officers and men received decorations from the V.C. downwards. Of all the war heroes, there have been none greater than these.
