1. TITLE: AIR-SEA RESCUE: AIRBORNE LIFEBOAT

- 2. San Francisco.... A sensational new wrinkle in air-sea rescue! The flying lifeboat—carried anywhere by B-17, then dropped to airmen stranded on the ocean. Twenty-seven feet long it weighs a ton and a half. But it's streamlined to fit right under the bomb-bay, and has no appreciable effect on the plane's speed or maneuverability. As soon as the airborne lifeboats are in full production, a bomber, like this one, will go along on all raids over water. In an emergency it can drop its unsinkable lifeboat...as shown by Army slow-motion cameras....
- 13. Three heavy-duty parachutes send it down gently, but accurately. And watertight compartments keep it upright and affoat, no matter how it lands.
- 17. For these make-believe "victims" there's a pleasant surprise -- aboard the lifeboat they find water and food for 60 days, two gasoline engines to earry them up to 500 miles, and sails to take them farther. Dramatic new help from the sky for men against the sea!
