GREENLAND.

COAST GUARD FOILS NAZI ATTEMPTS TO SET UP ARCTIC BASES.

Only a few hundred miles from the North Pole, U.S. cutters blast their way through a Greenland ice field - American destroy Nazi weather station which was sending vital radio reports to Germany. One Nazi crew scuttles its ship and surrenders and is taken aboard a coast guard cutter - Three German Guard smashes secret German bases in the Arctic.

Coast Guards within several hundred miles of the North Pole. Their cutter is caught in the ice, and they use depth charges to blast their way out. They've been sent to destroy German weather stations in the Arctic coast of Greenland. So blow up the ice.

Through the ice pack - one of three cutters which destroyed three Greenland stations from which Nazi expeditions were sending radio weather reports to Germany. Here they've arrived at one - and find it stocked with masses of supplies. Sneaking in ships to the Arctic shore, the Germans brought plenty along. And the Americans are pleased to note that not even the schnapps was forgotten.

Prisoners, they scuttled their ship and surrendered. Three vessels lost by the enemy and 60 prisoners of war are taken by the Coast guards - as they smash secret bases in the Arctic from which the Nazis were getting badly needed weather reports.
