By arrangement with Dutch authorities, Civil Affairs Sections in Holland have organized the evacuation of a large number of Dutch children to England. (First batch is of 500 with further batches to follow up to 11,000 in all). The children, selected from the poorer working classes, are in the great part undernourished due to the shortage of food resulting on four years of German Occupation and looting. It is in order that these children - the future citizens of Holland - should be properly nourished and developed, that the plan to send them to England was evolved - duration of stay to be approximately 3 months.
